PROPOSED CHANGES TO BUILDING: Designation, and terms of easement if any, are meant to protect the basis for designation - in the granary’s case, the intact original condition will be important. The state’s preservation architect who will weigh in, says, “half-dozen windows on one facade would be more likely to be acceptable than forty windows around the whole structure”. *Retain and repair* is a guiding principle. Compatible yet distinguishable additions are possible. The granary is largely *not* eligible for historic preservation tax credits.
